Snowmobiling and off-road vehicle use continues to grow in popularity and is an enjoyable form of personal and family recreation - if undertaken in a safe and responsible manner.



Based on student polls during our Safe Rider presentations more than 85%, often as high as 95%, of high school students in rural Alberta schools have ridden on an off-highway vehicle (OHV) of some kind. Off-highway or off-road vehicles such as snowmobiles, dirt bikes, quads and side by sides are growing in use for recreational, agricultural and industrial activities.

With the increased use comes an increase in the casualty rates. ATV's (summer OHV machines) and ATV-related hospitalizations have jumped 72 per cent over the last decade (researchers point to speed, alcohol, inexperience, improper apparel and non-use of helmets as the culprits). Bottom line, say the experts: among sports- and recreation-related activities, ATV-related pursuits are

now the third most common cause of severe injury (after cycling and snowmobiling). And they note that the demographic most affected is males aged 15 to 19.

The Alberta Snowmobile Association (ASA) is a non-profit volunteer organization founded in 1971 and is made up of clubs that actively work to improve snowmobiling in the province. We have taken an active role in educating our province's youth since 1997. The ASA Safe Rider's "Ride with Respect" curriculum was developed in partnership with the Government of Alberta, and other off road partners and professionals.

We can easily modify the program to suit any age and size of audience.

There is no cost to the schools for this program!

The booking schedule is established on a "first come – first served" basis. Dates & locations are arranged to minimize travel expenses while maximizing communities served.









The ASA Safe Riders Program is 60 - 90 minutes in length depending on the age range of your students. (The longer time frame allows for more student interaction, video clips and physical group activities.) The students review and expand their current knowledge of snowmobile and offroad vehicle safety issues and proper operation, local law requirements as well as the connection between peer pressure and rational decision making and serious off-road accidents.



To increase student engagement and interactivity we combine colorful displays, youth sized machines, clothing, helmets and backcountry survival gear, video clips, power-point visuals, student discussions, and physical activities. Avalanche safety related to motorized and non-



motorized use (skiing, snowboarding, climbing and hiking) in the backcountry will also be introduced depending on the needs and interests of the students. Where available, the ASA will contact the local RCMP detachment, Health Unit and snowmobile club to provide additional information relevant to your community. Please visit www.albertasaferiders.com to view a short video montage of our program.

Upon completion of this program safety materials from the ASA and the Avalanche Canada will be donated to the school's library or resource centre. A specially produced "Pocket Guide to Off-Highway Riding Safety", the ASA Alberta Snowmobile Trail Map and other materials will be made available to the students. Age appropriate online contests are used to follow up and 'test' the retention levels of the students, our measure of testing the effectiveness of our presentation methods and content.

Statistical information is available that supports the value of educating youth in making positive lifestyle choices (i.e. the use of tobacco and drinking and driving). We are confident, that as a result of the Safe Riders Program, young snowmobile and off-road enthusiasts are becoming more aware of the safety and environmental issues surrounding their sport and passing this learning on to the adults in their lives.

- two presentations to 450 K-Gr 6 students





- 90% of students have access to a quad or dirt bike at home




Ecole St Mary School - Whitecourt, AB
